EU Animal Health Policy

To protect and raise health status of animals

whilst permitting trade and imports





Harmonised animal health legislation



- Identification & registration
- Prevention
 - Biosecurity
 - Import conditions
 - Food and feed
- Monitoring and surveillance
- Control and eradication of major diseases
 - Emergency preparedness in case of outbreak of epizootic disease





Registration, identification and traceability

- Registration of "holdings": epidemiological unit
- Identification of animals
- Holding registers
- Movement documents and registration national databases
- Controls between Member States: pre-notification, certification, database (TRACES)





Harmonised control measuresmajor epizootic diseases

- Contingency plans contents defined in EU legislation
- Emergency exercises and alert drills also cross-border
- EU & National Reference Laboratories
- Diagnostic Manuals: uniform procedures to diagnose disease
- **Compulsory measures by MS:** immediate reporting, restrictions of movements & export in zones around the outbreak, depopulation, cleaning and disinfection, surveillance, lifting restrictions





Harmonised control measurescooperation & coordination


- Disease notifications and regular meetings
- **EU Veterinary Emergency Team** = experts from different MS. Available for assistance to MS during outbreaks. Occasionally also assisting third countries
- Measures at EU level where needed
- Audits by Commission





Animal Disease Notification System

- Primary outbreaks <24 hours, secondary once per week
- Information, mapping
- Summaries available on the Internet
- Detailed access for authorities
- Supports risk management at national and EU levels






Regionalisation by Member State

- Follows the general OIE principles
- Strict rules in EU legislation
- 1-3-10-150 Km restricted zones (depending on disease, in legislation)
- Tracing & epidemiological investigations
- Additional surveillance and testing
- Conditions for lifting measures
- Emergency vaccination under conditions





Regionalisation by EU Commission



- Specific legislation
- Bigger areas can be restricted
- Multiple Member States
- Defined rules for risk mitigation for all relevant commodities – extra layer of protection – close scrutiny
- Enhanced surveillance



EU internal market animals and animal products

- Based on comprehensive EU legislation
- Member State of origin responsible for the safety of the animals and products – no internal border controls
- Prior notification (EU database TRACES) and official certificates for animals and germplasm – can be controlled at destination
- "Country freedom" -> regionalisation
